**REPLY IN SUPPORT OF**  
**MOTION TO REJECT AMENDED REDISTRICTING PROCLAMATION PLAN**  
**AND FOR MODIFICATION OF ORDER ON REMAND**

In the interest of expediting consideration of their Motion to Reject Amended Redistricting Proclamation Plan and for Modification of Order on Remand (the “Motion”), Felisa Wilson, George Martinez, and Yarrow Silvers (collectively the “East Anchorage Plaintiffs”) stand on the merits of that Motion, the Superior Court Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law, and the Alaska Supreme Court summary Order. East Anchorage Plaintiffs have not, nor did they intend to, file a new challenge or trigger a renewed Civil Rule 90.8 application process, nor do East Anchorage Plaintiffs have the financial ability

to fund such an effort.<sup>1</sup> Instead, the East Anchorage Plaintiffs' Motion only seeks full compliance from the Alaska Redistricting Board with this Court's remand order.

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<sup>1</sup> In this Court's March 30, 2022 Order Following Remand from the Alaska Supreme Court, the Court expressly retained jurisdiction to "address any further issues arising from the Board's corrections or related issues in a timely manner." In light of this continued exercise of jurisdiction, East Anchorage Plaintiffs are in no way precluded by principles of *res judicata* or collateral estoppel from timely moving, as they did, for clarification or modification of previously-entered orders in the same proceeding.
